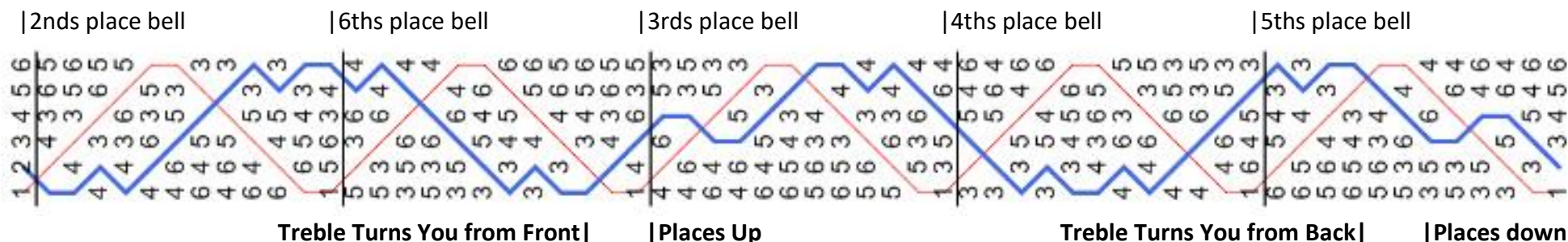


# Learning to Ring Double Court



There are many ways to learn and to ring Double Court: studying and learning the Circle of Work; studying and learning the Blue Line, either in sections that make sense to you or by place bell; learning and following these two rules:

1. **Treble Bob front and back unless you meet the Treble there.** (*You can't dodge with the Treble*)
2. **Plain Hunt up and down unless the treble turns you, in which case make far and near places.**

The terms far and near are relative to the direction you are going, up or down. When travelling up, far means make fourths and near means make thirds. When travelling down, far means make thirds and near means make fourths.

## When a Bob is called...

- If you are in 3rds place over the Treble, make 4ths and then continue by following the two rules given above. \*
- If you dodging at the back, either up or down, do two extra dodges, making a total of 3, and then continue by following the two rules given above.

*\*This is the same prompt as in a Plain Bob Minor Bob or Single.*

## When a Single is called...

- If you are in 3rds place over the Treble, make 4ths and then continue by following the two rules given above. \*
- If you are dodging 5-6 down, complete that dodge, make 5ths, dodge 5-6 up with the same bell and then lie and continue by following the two rules given above.
- If you are dodging 5-6 up, your blue line is unaffected. You lie over the bell you have just dodged with while it makes 5ths and then dodge 5-6 down with the same bell.
