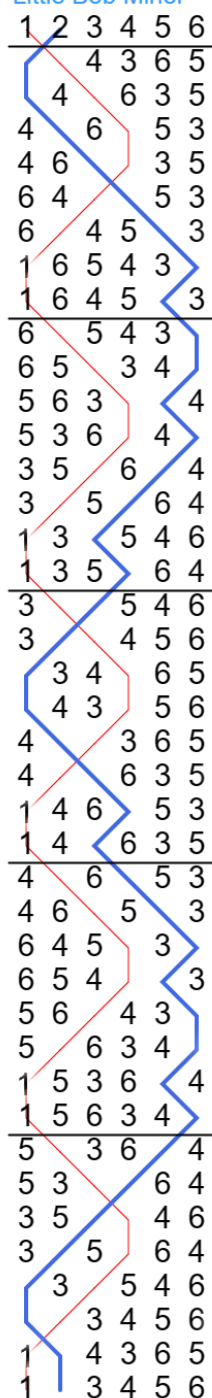


# Learning to Ring Little Bob Minor

## Little Bob Minor



As always, there are many ways to learn and to ring Little Bob Minor, including studying and learning the Circle of Work and studying and learning the Blue Line, either in sections that make sense to you, or by place bell. However, many find it easier to learn to ring by the Treble. Below you will find two ways of describing how to do this:

## 1. Short Verbal Prompts (A set of rules.)

**Make Seconds when the Treble turns you; dodge in 3/4 up and down when you can; always dodge in 5/6, both up and down.**

If you are familiar with Plain Bob Minor, these three verbal prompts, or rules, are all you need to ring Little Bob, so long as you remember that you can't dodge with the Treble.

Apart from when the Treble turns you from the lead, when you make seconds over the Treble and lead again, all you ever do is to hunt out to the back, lie and hunt back in again, dodging in 3/4 and 5/6 whenever you meet a working bell in those positions i.e. any bell other than the Treble. As the Treble only goes out as far as fourths place, you will never meet the Treble in 5/6 so you always dodge in 5/6, both up and down. On alternate occasions, both up and down, you will meet the Treble in 3/4 so you will not dodge. On the other occasions you will meet a working bell, so you do.

## 2. Where you pass the Treble on your way out

If you meet the Treble when you are in:

2nds Place: Make Seconds and lead again.

3rds Place: Dodge 3-4 up, 5/6 up and down, then straight in.

4ths Place: Straight out, dodge 5/6 up & down, dodge 3/4 down.

## Bobs

Bobs are the same as in Plain Bob Minor, remembering that you always dodge in 5/6, both up and down, when you get there:

If you were about to make seconds, run out and try again next time.

If you were about to dodge 3/4 up, make 4ths and in and try again next time.

If you were about to dodge 3/4 down, run in and try again next time.
