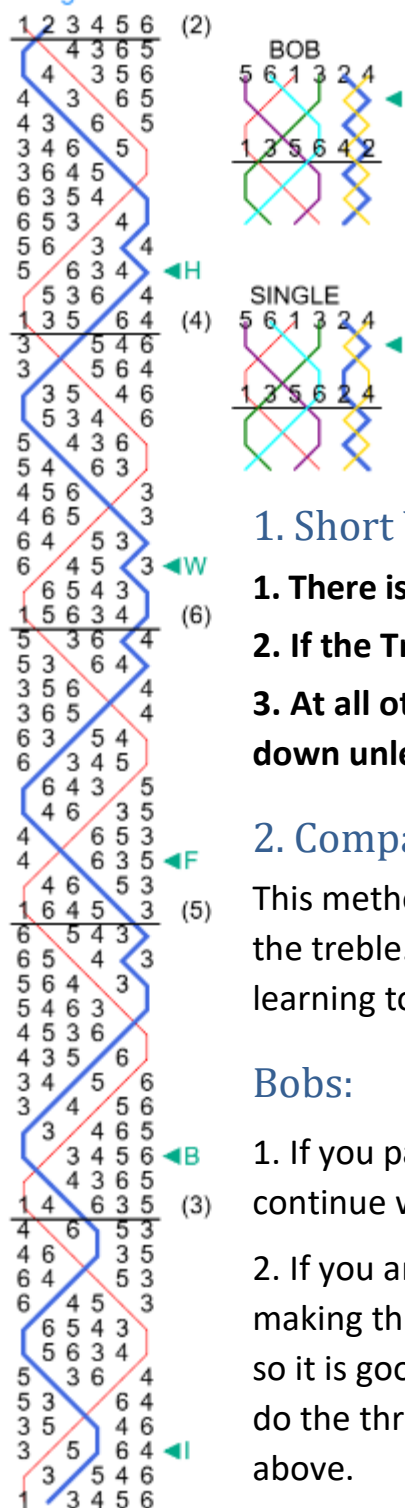


Learning to Ring Single Court

Single Court Bob Minor - for Bell: 2



As always, there are many ways to learn and to ring Single Court including studying and learning the Circle of Work and studying and learning the Blue Line, either in sections that make sense to you or by place bell. However, many find it easier to learn to ring by either learning a series of short verbal prompts or comparing the blue line to methods they have already learnt.

1. Short Verbal Prompts (A set of rules.)

- 1. There is never any dodging on the front or in 3-4.**
- 2. If the Treble takes you off the lead, make fourths twice.**
- 3. At all other times, plain hunt out and back, dodging in 5-6 up and down unless you meet the Treble. (*You can't dodge with the treble.*)**

2. Comparison with methods already learnt

This method is Double Court above the treble and Plain Hunt below the treble. This is interesting, but I do not recommend it as a way of learning to ring the method.

Bobs:

1. If you pass the Treble in 2-3 up, make fourths and in and then continue with the rules above. (*The same as Plain Bob Minor*)
2. If you are dodging up or down at the back, do two extra dodges making three in all. The middle dodge is when the treble is leading so it is good practice to say to yourself 'Dodge, Bob, Dodge' as you do the three dodges. After the dodges, continue with the rules above.

Singles:

1. If you pass the Treble in 2-3, make fourths and in and then continue with the rules above. (*The same as Plain Bob Minor*)

If you are dodging 5-6 down, make fifths and then dodge 5-6 up. Continue with the rules above. *(The bell which is dodging 5-6 up when the single is called is unaffected.)*
